The Columbus Sports Council has partnered with the NCSA to bring the World Series back to Columbus, Georgia in 2014 and 2015. The 2014 NCSA World Series is scheduled for May 16-18, 2014 and the 2015 World Series will be held May 15-17, 2015. The outstanding facilities, restaurants, and nightlife along with the southern hospitality provided by the Columbus Sports Council make Columbus, Georgia an ideal location for this National Championship tournament.
