Field of Teams Finalized for 2016 NCSA World Series

Pittsburgh, PA – The National Club Softball Association and the Columbus Sports Council are preparing to host the tenth annual NCSA World Series at the South Commons Complex in Columbus, GA. This is the seventh consecutive year that the league's season-finale event will be held at the beautiful softball facility at the South Commons Complex. The eight-field complex is located at 400 4th Street in Columbus, GA.



Qualifying teams will be separated into four pools for Pool Play games slotted at 11:00am, 2:00pm and 5:00pm on Friday, May 20th. After Pool Play has been completed, teams will be re-seeded and enter Elimination Play beginning at 11:00am on Saturday, May 21st. The National Championship game is scheduled for 4:45pm on Sunday, May 22nd.



A total of 16 collegiate club softball teams from around the country will be descending upon Columbus to compete for the league title. Participating teams will be representing 14 different states, including Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina and Virginia.
