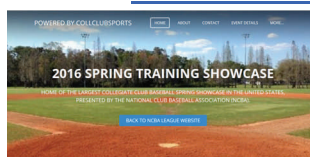


NCBA/NCSA Spring Training Registration Now Open!

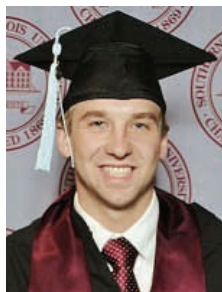

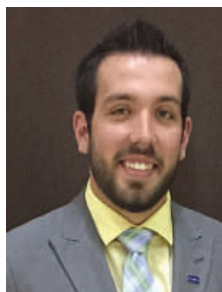

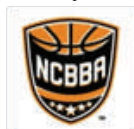
